Lori Anderson, Assistant Professor in the School of Nursing at the University of Northwestern-St. Paul saw the opportunity for FCN's to help with Serve the City 2018 and as a result she contacted Pastor Rob Warland at Hope Community Church about having her nursing students help for their Community Health Clinical. 8 students and one faculty served meals at House of Charity down the street, and the rest (14) were at the church. Just one woman came into the Warming Center, but we helped do security, meal prep, cleaning and reorganizing some of the rooms they had used with new beds, etc. Also, Pastor Rob from Hope and Laura, a staff member from Source MN, spoke at Chapel at UNW this week. The students have been studying about Human Trafficking in class and readings as well, so they were well-informed to take part in this outreach.

Encourage others to take the opportunity to have meaningful and heartfelt sharing about what matters most.

- 1. What makes life worth living?
- 2. What memories do you have of people in your life "living right up until the end"?
- 3. When you think of the future, who will be important in your life?
- 4. What do you want to be sure caregivers know about you?
- 5. If you could no longer communicate, what messages do you want to still be heard?
- 6. Who will share these messages for you?

Sharing your "bucket list" could be easier than discussing end-of-life medical preferences, and it might be just as useful to your physician, researchers suggest. Researchers say the "bucket list" conversation is a simple strategy to help patients consider health decisions. In learning these goals, clinicians are better suited to promote informed decision-making when discussing the potential impact of treatment options. (Medscape)
