

#### Verse of the Week:

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Matthew 5:4

The Elim Care FCN Network was blessed this past week by the sharing of Beth Moorhead, pastoral counselor on staff at Wayzata EFC, and Dee Sandberg, head of Caring Ministries from Wayzata EFC. Their GriefShare ministry provides support for those who have experienced a loss and their annual Evening of Remembrance honors the lives and memories of family members who have died. Pictures, meaningful objects and thoughts of the one who is gone are shared during the evening. Beth and Dee shared "lessons learned" and details in planning the meal and the service, which profoundly affects those family members who attend.

Grief thoughts shared by a fellow FCN:

As for grief, you'll find it comes in waves. When the ship is first wrecked, you're drowning, with wreckage all around you. Everything floating around you reminds you of the beauty and the magnificence of the ship that was, and is no more. And all you can do is float. You find some piece of the wreckage and you hang on for a while. Maybe it's some physical thing. Maybe it's a happy memory or a photograph. Maybe it's a person who is also floating. For a while, all you can do is float. Stay alive.

In the beginning, the waves are 100 feet tall and crash over you without mercy. They come 10 seconds apart and don't even give you time to catch your breath. All you can do is hang on and float. After a while, maybe weeks, maybe months, you'll find the waves are still 100 feet tall, but they come further apart. When they come, they still crash all over you and wipe you out. But in between, you can breathe, you can function. You never know what's going to trigger the grief. It might be a song, a picture, a street intersection, the smell of a cup of coffee. It can be just about anything...and the wave comes crashing. But in between waves, there is life.

**Somewhere down the line**, and it's different for everybody, you find that the waves are only 80 feet tall. Or 50 feet tall. And **while they still come, they come further apart**. You can see them coming. An anniversary, a birthday, or Christmas, or landing at O'Hare. You can see it coming, for the most part, and prepare yourself. And when it washes over you, you know that somehow

you will, again, come out the other side. Soaking wet, sputtering, still hanging on to some tiny piece of the wreckage, but you'll come out.

### **Blood Pressure Equipment Accuracy is Important**

CentraCare St. Cloud Hospital

"The St. Cloud Hospital Bio Med Department in 2005 agreed to have blood pressure equipment checked for accuracy for St. Cloud Area Parish Nurses. Bring your equipment to the Bio Med Department at the St. Cloud Hospital. Bio Med is located in the basement of the hospital.

Turnaround is a few days for testing digital and manual blood pressure equipment. Bio Med staff recommends BP equipment be checked annually and any time you are concerned about accuracy.

For questions, call 320-252-2700 and ask for Bio Med. No appointment is necessary. Bring between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.

\*Other Faith Community Nurses have taken blood pressure equipment to check for accuracy to hospitals in their area."
